# **General Education**

PennWest California students who are completing a Legacy Program are required to complete 40-41 credits of General Education coursework. This requirement is achieved by taking courses from a series of different "menus." Each menu has a list of courses that satisfy the menu goals. A student who has not previously competed a reguirement may select any course from the approrpiate menu, unless their major program of study has required a particular course. Program-specific General Education requirements are listed on the Student's Degree Audit in DegreeWorks. Students should always consult with an academic adviser or their department chair regarding any program-specific General Education requirements.
